The 10 producers who registered the most Angus beef cattle in the state of Pennsylvania recorded a total of 507 Angus with the American Angus Association during fiscal year 2018, which ended Sept. 30, according to Allen Moczygemba, Association chief executive officer.

The 10 top recorders in Pennsylvania are: Beaver Creek Angus, Thomasville; Greg Mc Kean, Mercer; Mc Kean Bros, Mercer; Oak Hill Angus Farm, Avella; Em Brook Angus, Schellsburg; Lorson Angus Farms, Jersey Shore; Pennsylvania State Univ, University Park; Cherry Knoll Farm Inc, West Grove; Karma Springs Angus, Blain; Howard & Audrey Updyke, Meshoppen.

Angus breeders across the nation in 2018 registered 327,067 head of Angus cattle. "Our growth this fiscal year continues to demonstrate strong demand for Angus genetics and solidifies our long-held position as a leader in the beef cattle industry," Moczygemba says. "These results underscore our members' commitment to providing genetic solutions to the beef cattle industry."

Pennsylvania Native Crowned Miss American Angus

With the crowning of Madison Weaver, Ephrata, Pennsylvania, Miss American Angus (MAA) took its first steps into its 51st year. Chosen from the pool of Auxiliary scholarship winners, the five candidates competed during the fifth-annual Angus Convention hosted in Columbus, Ohio, Nov. 3-5, 2018. Contestants for the title included Weaver; Lindsey Decker, Philo, Illinois; Reagan Skow, Palisade, Nebraska; McKayla Raines, Seaman, Ohio; and Katie Brock, Stilesville, Indiana.

"The Miss American Angus candidates this year were once again top notch," said Cindy Ahearn, American Angus Auxiliary president. "As the start of a new half century, this year's Miss American Angus is a special one, and we are excited to work with Madison this year."

Each contestant applied for the scholarship competition in the spring, and the application was considered in the judging for the title. While in Ohio, each contestant gave a speech titled "Believing in Better", answered impromptu questions, took a written exam and were interviewed by three judges.

"This contest taught me a lot about how to deal with nerves; sometimes I can get myself worked up," Weaver said. "This contest taught me how to control that and to just be myself no matter what."

Snatching every opportunity available is something the newly crowned MAA learned from her mother. Weaver credits her mother, queen in her own right in the dairy industry, for the encouragement and confidence to compete for the title.

"I remember checking the box that I wanted to run for Miss American Angus and just thinking 'wow, this is really happening,'" Weaver said.

Weaver witnessed leading by example from previous MAA title holders who left a lasting impression on the previous Miss Pennsylvania Angus. She is excited to continue advocating for the Angus breed and cattle industry while serving as a mentor for aspiring, young Angus breeders.

"Wearing the crown is an amazing and humbling opportunity," Weaver said. "I am honored to walk in the footsteps of previous title holders of Miss American Angus."

Thankful for her roots on the East coast, Weaver is looking forward to visiting producers all across the nation. The Midwest in particular catches her eye as the National Western Stock Show (NWSS) hosted in Denver, Colorado, is her first event in this new role.

"I have never been to Denver for the National Western, so I am really looking forward to that," Weaver said as she tried to steady her hands and control the growing smile.

"When I walked on stage, I figured there was no way I would be crowned, that I would just head home and business as usual," Weaver said. "When they called my name, all sorts of emotions flew through my head. When Cindy Ahearn hugged me, that made it real." The Penn State University freshman is studying animal science and agricultural business with aspirations to study ruminant nutrition and possibly attend veterinary school.

"Of course, I want to leave a lasting legacy, but I am looking forward to gaining more knowledge about the industry and helping producers improve their herds any way I can, too," Weaver said. "The NJAA [National Junior Angus Association] truly prepared me to carry this title. I am so thankful for the opportunities provided by the Association."

BSE Crisis Averted - Thanks, Beef Checkoff

This week's BSE news from <u>Florida was a non-event</u>. The fact it became a non-event means consumers weren't unduly frightened about eating beef, nor were markets see-sawed by volatility from uncertainty.

In fact, more industry harm was done by a sensational and irresponsible article by Consumer Reports – "What's Really In Your Meat?" – published this week that purports to analyze the amounts of banned or severely restricted drugs that may end up on your dinner plate in the form of beef.

The common silver lining of these two events is they underscored the value of your beef checkoff, and the work it does on your behalf to minimize the damage from unexpected crises. To fully appreciate that this week's news was a blip rather than an eruption, one must remember the events of 15 years ago.

The beef checkoff program is much more than the "Beef. It's What's For Dinner!" campaign. On Dec. 23, 2003, Ag Secretary Ann Veneman announced in a hastily called news conference the nation's first case of bovine spongiform encephalapathy (BSE) – also referred to as mad cow disease – had been discovered near Yakima, Wash. Overnight, many nations halted beef imports from the U.S., and executives at beef and dairy trade associations cancelled any last-minute Christmas shopping to field nonstop calls from media.

Less widely known is the fact USDA alerted industry groups such as the National Cattlemen's Beef Association that the BSE announcement was forthcoming. NCBA, a contractor to the beef checkoff, was not caught flat-footed. In fact, they had an emergency plan in place for nearly 10 years in the event of such a crisis.

Each year an audit of checkoff-funded work is completed by an independent third party. The beef checkoff's public relations team earned high marks for its handling of the BSE crisis in 2003 and 2004, with the auditor saying, "the PR program helped pave the way for neutral and/or positive coverage of beef' during the crisis.

Further, the auditor said, "the PR team's BSE preparation work and skilled media management during the first reported BSE case won numerous PR industry awards for excellence in 2005 and, more importantly, worked to maintain media and consumers' assurance in beef safety when the second BSE case was discovered."

Those PR victories help alleviate consumer concerns over BSE at home, but the loss of beef's export markets due to BSE hysteria abroad cost American cattlemen billions of dollars in lost sales. The 2003 beef export value was \$3 billion, which dropped to \$1.1 billion in 2004 due to BSE. Over time, U.S. exports recovered and made inroads into new markets. In 2017 the value of U.S. beef exports was \$7.3 billion, and this year export values were up 21% through June, totaling \$4 billion, on pace to eclipse \$8 billion for the year. The beef checkoff's role in crisis management and subsequent promotion of U.S. beef to our trading partners has played a huge role in that success.

U.S. Beef is World-Renowned for Quality and Safety

Successfully communicating factual information about BSE and the firewalls in place to protect the food supply has now made BSE announcements ho-hum events.

Similarly, when activists or organizations target beef with skewed or dishonest claims, the beef checkoff is prepared to answer. This week, when Consumer Reports published its article that based findings on unconfirmed residue screening tests of meats, the checkoff <u>issued a statement</u> warning consumers that the information was false and misleading.



A statement attributed to John Robinson, vice president of membership and communications at NCBA, said, "Knowingly printing inaccurate and misleading articles, which rely on information that is known to be false, misleads consumers about the competency of the current food safety programs in place at USDA. Those programs have long been the global gold standard for food safety and today they continue to provide overlapping safeguards to ensure consumers are receiving wholesome and safe products."

Even <u>USDA's Food Safety and Inspection Service felt compelled to correct</u> Consumer Reports' article, calling it "sensational and fear-based infotainment aimed at confusing shoppers with pseudoscience and scare tactics."

Robinson's statement continued: "The author of 'What's Really in Your Meat?' admits that the article's findings are uncertain and any potential risks are unknown. The reality is that America's beef producers take food safety seriously, as do the government agencies that regulate and monitor production in the United States. To suggest otherwise is false and irresponsible."

Thanks to cattlemen-funded checkoff programs, this week's potential market disruptors were non-events.


