# 2021 National Junior Angus Association's Raising the Bar Officer Training

# **Quality Carcass Spreads Turn Up Early**

Last week's fed cattle trade rounded out February and a full month of \$114/cwt. weekly average prices. The two weeks in the middle of the month marked by extreme weather and insufficient fed cattle to harvest-space put a cap on cattle prices as packers found themselves well-supplied.

The large 666K-head federally inspected slaughter last week was packers' best effort at backfilling the boxed beef pipeline as processing logistics returned to normal. Unfortunately for cattle feeders, the short-term bottleneck came at a time when finished cattle inventories were still bulging. Look for another large weekly slaughter this week, as packers have every incentive to keep the pipeline full.



The leading indicator that feed yards need to regain currentness is carcass weights. The latest confirmed report shows combined steer and heifer carcass weights remain 20 lb. heavier than a year ago and 35 lb. heavier than the same week in 2019.

The carcass weight issue has become quite a tired topic for many of us but looking at it through a different lens puts it in perspective. Multiplying that 20 lb. of extra weight across 500,000 head, for example, yields the equivalent of an additional 11,627 lb. of carcasses. Granted, increased production is coming through the system in larger cuts of boxed beef and grinds, which don't use any additional shackle space in the packing plant. Yet the added tonnage on the market is not insignificant.

Cutout values have been on an amazing departure from seasonal norms through February, reaching their second highest point in history for the month. February 2015 posted a higher cutout price peak than February 2021 but fed cattle supplies were in a shortage then. Even with the weather interruptions in the packing sector last month the weekly slaughter totals for fed cattle were 14% larger than in February 2015.

Ribeyes and strip loins are still pricing well above their normal range for the past few weeks and middle meats continue to be the hot subprimal price movers. A break in boxed beef prices is surely coming ahead of the spring buying frenzy.

# QUALITY CARCASS SPREADS TURN UP EARLY

In the last edition of the Insider, we focused on the Choice/Select price spread. So far in 2021, Choice carcasses are at a higher premium to Select than in any of the previous five years. This is important, not because Choice carcasses are the production target, but because the producer's share of the Choice premium is the foundation on which CAB and Prime premiums are added. Since January 1, the USDA Grid Premiums and Discounts report shows an average Choice premium of \$12.08/cwt. compared to the five-year average of \$5.49/cwt.

Successful grid marketing in today's production environment often requires a higher degree of marbling achievement than the Choice grade. When yield grade 4 and heavyweight carcasses are as prevalent as they've been for months, it takes more premiums to surpass the discounts.

Fortunately, CAB and Prime premiums have remained at elevated price points thus far in the 1st quarter. The charts illustrate the CAB premium on a higher trajectory than any of the previous five years, reaching a \$5.59/cwt. weighted average across packers in the latest data. It's notable that CAB-certified carcasses have also been more numerous on a weekly basis than in any of the comparison years.

A similar picture exists for Prime grid premium vales in 2021 as well. The year-to-date Prime premium has averaged \$15.07/cwt., which is \$1.79/cwt. above the five-year average. The Prime comparison differs from the CAB premium comparison in that the Prime price was higher in 2018 for the time period described.

It's also clear in the charts that the Prime grid price is on a decreasing plane since mid-January. This stands in contrast to the increasing CAB premium, although both of these carcass categories have seen plentiful supplies in 2021 as a proportion of the total.

The fact that Prime carcasses constituted almost 12% of the national steer and heifer carcass mix for the week of February 15th is the likely cause behind the premium decline we're describing. This is easily a record Prime share of the total during a period that has seen 6% to 10% Prime carcasses in February of the previous five years.

This detailed assessment of high marbling, premium carcass trends is more than rhetoric from a source vested in the premium branded beef business. Rather, it's a depiction of the true price drivers in today's beef market. During a period in which frustration is abundant surrounding price discovery and price mechanisms for fed cattle, these are price signals that are above expectations compared to most recent years.



While the noted challenges are very real and not to be dismissed, we're simultaneously experiencing exceptional beef demand for the very best product that we collectively have to offer.

#### GENETICS MAKE ALL THE DIFFERENCE

Spring bull sales have been well underway for weeks and the market for quality Angus bulls is proving to be quite good again. Genetic merit is so important to the total production picture—it's the one decision that we make every year with intentions that our investment pays off in accrued benefits over time.

Selecting bulls that will sire replacement heifers opens up the entire array of EPDs and selection indexes as potential priorities for cow/calf producers. Understandably, when selecting bulls in herds where replacement heifer will be kept, cattlemen rank marbling below their top five priorities. The prioritization process often hinges on how engaged the producer is with the next sector of the beef supply chain. Those retaining ownership through the feedlot and others marketing feeder calves with a reputation for performance and carcass merit will likely deploy minimum thresholds for terminal traits, such as carcass merit and post weaning growth.

Our Targeting the Brand<sup>TM</sup> program assists Angus bull buyers in readily identifying bulls that should sire calves with above-average potential to meet the CAB brand specifications at harvest. With a goal of at least 50% CAB accepted carcasses, the thresholds for both the Marbling EPD and \$Grid indexes for the program have been set to easily identify qualified sires whose progeny will distance themselves from the industry average of 36% CAB acceptance.

May is Beef month is just around the corner. We wanted to share with the agriculture community the efforts we'll be employing for the month-long effort celebrating, BEEF!

#### 2021-PENNSYLVANIA ANGUS BREEDERS SHOW Rules and Regulations

#### July 1, 2 & 3

- 1. All Exhibitors must be members of the PA Angus or Junior Angus Associations. Any member of these Associations is eligible as long as their membership is valid on June 15 preceding the show.
- 2. **READ CAREFULLY:** All animals must be owned/transferred by **JUNE 15<sup>th</sup>.** A junior must show his/her own cattle. Out of state juniors may show only PA bred cattle in the junior show. PA resident juniors only in showmanship.
- 3. All entry forms must be sent to the PA Angus Association no later than **JUNE 15<sup>th</sup>**, with appropriate fees.
- 4. All junior heifers, bulls, and cow/calf pairs are eligible to be shown in the Breeders Show Open Class. The entry fee for heifers and bulls for both shows is a total of \$30/head. Entry fees for cow/calf pairs for both shows is \$45/pair. Steers show in the junior show only and are \$20/head.
- 5. Entries received after June 15 will be charged double entry fee. Substitutions will be accepted at double entry fee.
- 6. Each exhibitor must supply his/her own feed, hay and straw (for tie outs). Free bark bedding will be provided in the barn.
- 7. All animals must have a legible tattoo in both ears, which corresponds to the registration paper. CHECK YOUR TATTOO BEFORE COMING TO THE SHOW! Exhibitors must bring original registration papers to the show. MAKE SURE YOU HAVE YOUR REGISTRATION PAPERS IN HAND TWO WEEKS BEFORE THE SHOW—copies cannot be used. Tattoos will be checked.
- 8. Each exhibitor must keep manure removed from the aisle behind the animals and deposit it at the place designated outside the building. Each exhibitor must clean up his entire tie out area before leaving the show grounds at the completion of the show.
- 9. All exhibitors and cattle must be in place by 12:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 1<sup>st</sup>, and will be released when all activities are completed.
- 10. THE PA ANGUS ASSOCIATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS VOTED TO FOLLOW THE AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION RULES CONCERNING COLORING AGENTS: "...no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited." THIS RULE PERTAINS TO SHOWS WHICH ARE SPONSORED BY THE PA ANGUS ASSOCIATION ALSO, WHICH WOULD INCLUDE THIS BREEDERS SHOW.
- 11. All blocking chutes must be used in designated areas.
- 12. No dogs allowed on the fairgrounds! (Fair Board Policy)
- 13. The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry offered and to require the removal from the grounds any exhibit which the Show Committee feels for any reason to deem unfit.
- 14. The exhibitor assumes all risks for damage or loss either to person or property. It is further expressly understood and agreed between exhibitor and the Huntingdon County Fairgrounds, which the show incurs no liability or obligation to the exhibitor other than to permit the exhibitor to use the buildings or grounds for exhibit.
- 15. Exhibitors must allow their cattle to be used in judging, showmanship contests or demonstrations if asked to do
- 16. All decisions of the show committee are final.
- 17. Any or all premiums will be calculated after the show, and will be paid when all bills have been received and paid.
- 18. Fifty (50) head need to be shown in the Open Show to qualify for premiums from the American Angus Association.
- 19. Angus steers can be shown by PA Angus Association Junior members only. The Grand Champions and Reserves may be blood typed.
- 20. Under American Angus Association rules, standard class breaks do not have to be used in dividing classes. Classes will be divided after all the cattle are checked in. The show committee reserves the right to divide divisions based on entry numbers.
- 21. All vendors must register with the Show Committee prior to the Show.
- 22. Spotlight Show—eligible heifers for this show had to be purchased on the 2018, 19, 20 Finest Female Sale.
- 23. No nurse cows are allowed on the premises.
- 24. Due to more cattle and the bark situation, the show committee will do stalling assignments. If you have someone you need stalled with, please indicate with entries, or contact Jamie Brozman by June 15<sup>th</sup> with requests. All attempts will be made to accommodate your requests.

#### JUNIOR SHOW CLASSIFICATION

All junior events will take place on Thursday and Friday. All junior cattle are encouraged to also be entered in the open show on Saturday. Please make sure you have the cattle at the show by 12:00 p.m. check in time on Thursday.

#### **RULES FOR JUNIOR SHOW:**

- 1. Ownership/transfer and entry deadlines will be June 15<sup>th</sup>, along with membership deadline.
- 1. A junior must show his/her own cattle.
- 2. Out of state juniors may show only PA bred cattle in junior show.
- 3. PA resident juniors in showmanship only.
- 4. Any PA junior Angus member may participate in Showmanship, you are permitted to use an animal other than your own. (Approved 10/5/12 PA Angus BOD)
- 5. Ages of juniors showing in Junior show must correspond with National Junior Angus Show rules, except for Showmanship. Junior must be 8 years of age on January 1, 2021.

JUNIOR COW/CALF CLASS-Cow may be any age, calf must <280 days born on or after 9-24 2020 and must be a bred and owned calf—the pair must be in the junior name only. Calf must have its own registration paper. Calf may also be shown in bred and owned heifer or bull show. Grand Champion and Reserve Cow/Calf.

<u>JUNIOR BRED AND OWNED BULL SHOW</u>—Junior bred and owned bulls calved on or after January 1, 2020, shown by class, no divisions. Bulls born before 1/1/21 must be shown with a nose lead. Grand and Reserve Grand Champion bred and owned bull.

<u>JUNIOR REGISTERED ANGUS STEER SHOW</u>—steers born after January 1, 2020. Steers will be weighed and shown by age.

<u>JUNOR BRED AND OWNED HEIFER SHOW</u>—Heifers calved after September 1, 2019 and bred by the junior. Heifers will be shown by class and division, beginning with the youngest. Junior heifer calf champion and reserve; senior heifer calf champion and reserve; intermediate champion and reserve; junior champion and reserve; senior champion and reserve, and Grand Champion Heifer and reserve.

<u>JUNIOR SPOTLIGHT SHOW</u>—Heifers purchased at the 2018, 2019 & 2020 Finest Female Sale and calved after September 1, 2019.

<u>JUNIOR OWNED HEIFER SHOW</u>—Heifers purchased by a junior member and in that juniors name only, and calved after September 1, 2019. Heifers will show by class and division, beginning with the youngest. Same divisions as listed in bred and owned heifer show.

<u>JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP</u>--All juniors who sign up will be divided into different age groups at the discretion of the show committee. Each participant will receive a gift compliment of Frey Show supply. The Grand Champion and Reserve will be selected with special awards! Ages will be divided evenly at the show. **JUNIOR PREMIER BREEDER** will be awarded at the conclusion of the Junior shows.

#### **BREEDERS SHOW HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

#### **EXHIBITION OR SHOW REQUIREMENTS FOR CATTLE:**

Cattle shall be identified by an official ear tag or other unique identification device approved by PDA. Official identification includes: A USDA-issued National Uniform Ear tagging System (NUES) ear tag having a US shield; or A 15 digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) ear tag starting with "840" and having a US shield; or Other identification approved by the PDA (brands and breed registrations with tattoos are not acceptable).

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2021.
- 2. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI.

#### It is Recommended

1. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is for animals 3 months of age and older market steers do not need rabies (observe appropriate slaughter withdraw time).

#### **GROUP CLASSES**

- **23.** Breeder Six Head. The exhibitor must be the breeder and first owner of the animals exhibited in individual classes. The breeder and first owner must have the same member code. Any sex.
- 24. Pennsylvania Special: Two head, any age, bred and owned or co-owned by exhibitor.
- **25.** Premier Breeder Award is presented to the breeder who accumulates the most points: 5 pts 1st place; 4 pts 2nd place; 3pts 3rd place; 2 pts 4th place; 1 pt 5th place. Points are given for individual classes only on bulls and heifers. No points for champions or groups or cow/calf classes. In case of ties, sixth place to be counted on a 1 pt basis. This is open show only. The same parameters are used for the junior show.
- **26.** Premier Exhibitor award, computed from winnings: 3pts 1st place; 2 pts 2nd place; 1 pt 3rd place. 3 points for Grand Champion and 2 points for Reserve Grand Champion.
